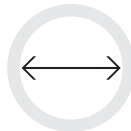

WHICH RING SIZE?

BEFORE PRINTING

Ensure that page scale is set to '100%' or 'None' in your printing setup. Measure the bar on the right to ensure it is exactly 50 mm long. Check settings and reprint if not accurate.

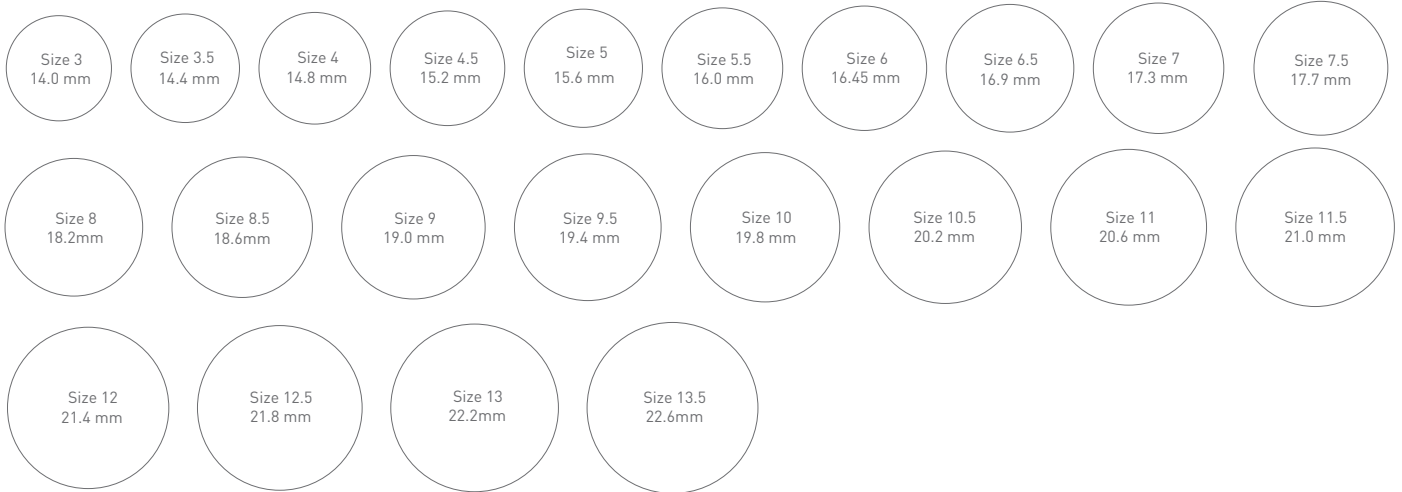

METHOD 1

Measure Current Ring

1. Select a ring that properly fits the intended finger. Engagement and wedding rings are traditionally worn on the ring finger (finger between the little and middle finger) on the left hand in Australia
2. Place the ring over the circles below, matching the inside edge of the ring to the circle nearest in size. This measurement refers to the diameter of the ring. If the ring falls between two sizes, order the larger size.



METHOD 2

Measure Finger



1. Cut out the above 'finger sizer'. Make a small cut in the left end of the sizer
2. Wrap the sizer around the intended finger with numbers facing out
3. Slide the pointed end of the sizer through the cut
4. Move the sizer to the largest part of the finger, this may be the knuckle
5. Pull tightly. The sizer must fit snugly to produce an accurate size
6. The number that lines up at the cut is your ring size for that finger

NOTE

Avoid measuring when fingers are cold because this is when fingers are their smallest. Measure your finger at the end of the day when it is at its largest.
